# MIDWAY

**Essentials**

- Midway is located 28 degrees latitude north. The international dateline is 140 miles west of Midway.
- Midway is approximately 25 to 30 million years old, formed by the same volcanic hot spot that created the Hawaiian Islands.
- The atoll lies approximately 2,800 miles west of San Francisco, 2,200 miles east of Tokyo and 1,200 miles northwest of Honolulu.
- Midway time is one hour later than Honolulu, three hours later than Los Angeles (four hours later during Daylight Savings Time.)
- Midway is not part of the state of Hawaii, therefore, U.S. visitors need to bring proof of citizenship, such as a passport, military ID card, birth certificate or voter registration card is acceptable.

# legacy letter

## LONG LOST FRIENDS BECOME FOUND.

Tim, I am returning this letter to you, I've have read this letter a lot since 1967, it been 38 years since you sent it and there has not been a day that I have not regretted not writing you back. At the time I thought, filled with my youthful sentiments that there would be plenty of time to write you back, after all you would be in Viet Nam for 13 months. I never thought that you would die after all you were only 20 years old we would all live a long time and have plenty of time to talk about the past. a lot has happened in 38 years, we are in another war against terrorist and in Iraq and Afghanistan Marines are fighting and dying again to date about 500 brother Marines have been killed. I think once again how you, me and Franny Bunting were sitting in the diner in Drexel Hill in 1966 and we all talked about joining the Marines, how young we were full of pride and Patriotism how tough we thought we were and how much we all wanted to be Marines. As once again Memorial Day approaches I think about you and the sacrifice you have made. Yesterday was my son Michael's Graduation from the University of Delaware the class of 2005, the Graduation speaker spoke of history and hero's. he said that we never think that the makers of history would be remembered for what they did until many years after the deed. I have always remembered what you did and how you died to me you will always be my hero. My son's have been brought up knowing what you did, each Memorial Day since 1969 I have visited your grave and since my boys, Michael, Thomas and David have been old enough to know the meaning of Memorial Day they have made the trip from Delaware to Saint Peter and Paul's. You are the first grave we visit and then Charley MC Grath's and others who were KIA in Viet Nam. This year it will be only David and me My oldest son Michael is away deciding what to do next, my second son Thomas is a Marine graduating from Paris Island last September and being deployed to Okinawa on June 5th for 7 months. I'm sure when his turn comes for Iraq he will be prepared. When he was in Boot Camp he asked for some motivation so he could see the reason for continuing so I wrote and reminded him about you and the ultimate sacrifice you made and how the meaning of Semper Paratus really means that we never forget what made us United States Marines and what we had to do to get that title. I'm inclosing a picture of my son so all you Marines in heaven can keep an eye out for the Boot.

# The Great Curtain Call



## THE WAR

### Timothy McHugh

On Feb. 9, 1968, two days after his 21st birthday, Pfc. Timothy D. McHugh of the U.S. Marine Corps was killed in action at Quang Nam.

Eighteen days later, his body arrived in a flag-draped casket at Philadelphia International Airport. Color guards from Bonner High School, of which he was a graduate, and American Legion Post 227 of Springfield, Delaware County, took part in a brief but solemn ceremony at planeside.

Timothy's mother, Mrs. Edward A. McHugh, of 612 Shipley la., Springfield, sadly remembered that day last night.

"MY TEARS ARE ALL over with at this point," she said, though her voice betrayed her emotion.

"I JUST HOPE MY SON didn't die in vain. God put him here and I think God took him and he died for a good cause—his country."

"I'm not bitter about anything." Timothy and his twin, Michael, were born Feb. 7, 1947, in Hawaii, where their father, a Navy commander, was stationed. Michael served in the Army. He was stationed on Okinawa and did not see Vietnam service. The McHughs have three other children.

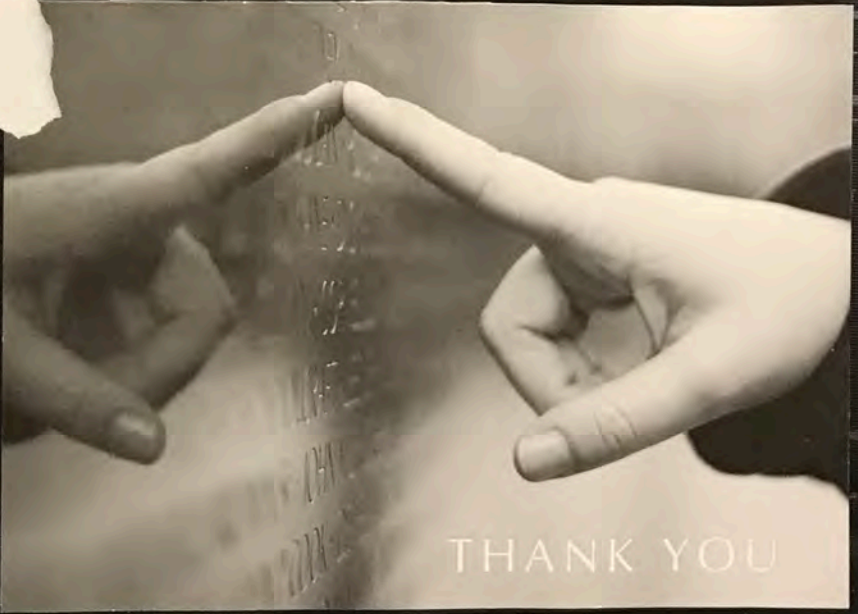
